Students Satisfaction SurveyFeedback Analysis Report -2020-21

The college has collected feedback from the students. Google Form is being used for this purpose (Link - https://forms.gle/ZuTRDtLV85dL5CwN6). We have received feedback of 1586 students. Out of which 57.4% male students and 42.6% female students submitted their feedback of academic year 2020-21. 69.3% students were from under graduate classes & 23.7% students were from post graduate classes. 53.2% students were from commerce background, 24.4% students were from Arts background and 22.1% students were from science background.

The feedback collected from the students was analyzed. The suggestions given by the students are related to the teaching learning process. The major observations are as follows.

Most of the students are satisfied with:

- 1) The syllabus covered.
- 2) Teachers' preparation for lectures.
- 3) Teachers' communication.
- 4) Teaching approach of teachers.
- 5) Internal evaluation process.
- 6) Discussion on performance on assignment.
- 7) Promoting internship, students' exchange, field visits opportunities.
- 8) Teacher mentoring process for overall development.
- 9) Opportunities to learn and grow.
- 10) Information expected competencies of Pos and Cos.
- 11) Follow up by the mentors.
- 12) Conceptual clarity by teachers.
- 13) SWOC analysis of students.
- 14) Students' engagement in quality development.
- 15) Use of student centric methods.



- 16) Participation in extracurricular activities.
- 17) Efforts for soft, life skills, development of employability skills.
- 18) Use of ICT tools by teachers.
- 19) Overall quality of teaching learning process.

Action taken report

- 1. Demand for offline lectures.
 - Due to covid-19 pandemic situation online lectures were conducted. On the basis of guidelines of state government and the University, offline lectures will be organized.
- 2. Feedback should be collected by the teachers while teaching.
 - > Instructions were given to the faculty to collect feedback frequently.
- 3. Mentoring process should be strengthening.
 - ➤ All the Heads of the departments instructed the faculty members of their respective department to strengthen the mentoring process and provide guidance whenever needed.
 - 4. Wi-Fi facility should be improved.



- > The College provided Wi-Fi facility to each department and also in the library.
- 5. More practical approach and experiential learning opportunities.
 - > All the departments were instructed to organize more number of practical based activities and experiential learning opportunities.
- 6. Guidance of more types of competitive examinations.
 - > The competitive exam cell was instructed to organize lectures on various types of competitive exams
- 7. Introduction of more number of vocational courses.
















F) What subject area are you currently pursuing? 1,585 responses












- 6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?








- 9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.








- 12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.







17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities. 1,586 responses




19. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.
